We are seeking 10 volunteers to participate in a Master's dissertation study.

The study title is: "Socio-economically disadvantaged young adult perceptions of how their father-child relationship influenced the decision to attend university: a thematic analysis."

What does it involve?

We would like to interview you find out about your relationship with your father/father-figure (e.g. step-father) and your experience of applying to university.

The interview will take approximately one hour and will be conducted face-to-face or online, depending on personal preference. The interview will be individually recorded and analysed for themes alongside the other interviews.

Who are we looking for?

We need 10 volunteers who match the requirements for this study. These requirements are:

- 18-25 years old
- Current or former student
- Qualified for free school meals while at school
- Both parents did not attend university

Reasons to take part:

- The opportunity to gain first-hand experience of a research study
- The opportunity to contribute to a study that will advance research into the father-child relationship and the barriers facing potential university students from a socio-economically disadvantaged background.

What you can expect from us:

- We take your privacy seriously. All participants will remain anonymous.
- You can withdraw at any point without explanation during the study.
- The only people with access to your data are the dissertation supervisor and student researcher.
- This research is for a Master's dissertation. It is not sponsored by the University of Liverpool nor for any commercial purpose.
